GOLDEN GATE BAY CRUISE - OCTOBER 16

Please see the September newsletter for information on the cruise itself and for scenario CalTrain and Bart routes.

Here is the scenario for the outing:

- 1. we all arrive at the Red and White Fleet Terminal on Pier 43 1/2 at least 45 minutes prior to the 10:45 AM cruise departure (aim for getting there around 10:00).
- 2. we board the 10:45 tour boat and do the Golden Gate Bay Cruise.
- 3. we return to Pier 43 1/2 around noon.
- 4. we walk to "Fishermen's Grotto" for lunch (2851

Taylor Street).

5. we head home or... There are many things to see and do in the Fisherman's Wharf area, you might want to hang for awhile before heading home.

To get tickets for the excursion, call 415 673 2900 (you may need to press 0 after the intro) and order your tickets for the "Golden Gate Bay Cruise" - you then pick them up at the terminal.

Or you can order them on line by going to http://www.redandwhite.com. Click "Book Online", then "Golden Gate Bay Cruise". Fill in the booking info and press "submit booking".

Or you can buy them at the terminal. The tickets are \$24 for on-line booking and \$20 (\$4 saving) if you book over the phone or buy them at the terminal. The tickets are open (not specific to a date/time).

To get directions from GoogleMaps go to: http://maps.google.com. Once there, click on "Get Directions", then fill in your starting point and for the ending point, type "Red and White Fleet, San Francisco, CA".

If you plan to drive, there are several parking lots in the area. I checked parking prices (on the web) for Central Parking at Talor St. and Jefferson St. - the weekend rate is \$10 for up to 12 hours.

NCKCC'S HANDCRAFTED & SPECIAL INTEREST CAR SHOW

The Northern California Kit Car Club's 28th Annual show, a two-day show at the Hilton Hotel in Concord, California went off smoothly, and was blessed with clear skies and comfortable temperatures in the low 80s.

The show car count was down a bit due to the sick economy in California, but we enjoyed a greater variety of cars both old and new. Our kit cars spanned a full spectrum and our Special Interest

Class included cars from custom Corvettes and AMX Javelins to T-Roadsters, '32 Fords & a Mini-Delahaye.

Wes Abendroth brought his historic silver 1965 Fiberfab Centurion from Nevada. Many people would mistake this car for a Corvette concept car, but it was built by Fiberfab in Sunnyvale and was inspired by the Stingray Racer designed by Peter Brock. Powered by a 327 Chevy V-8 it is campaigned in Vintage Racing, most recently at the 2010 Monterey Historic Races. Wes took home 1st Place in Class A Sports.

Richard Mauro trailered his 1958 LaDawri from Klamath Falls, Oregon and won the 2nd Place trophy for Class A Sports. This Chevy V-8 powered beauty was also shown at the 2010 AHA show in Pomona and is an outstanding car.

Another historic entry was a Mercedes 300SL replica, dressed as a '57 LeMans Factory race car. It was found after 50 years in a San Gabriel backyard in sorry shape. Dave Wolin, with some expert help, restored it to its present racing form and has entered a number of events.

Among the new cars, Doug Abadie brought his Superlite Roadster (SLR), which is an exo-skeleton (external frame) car powered by a 243 HP Acura mounted in a transverse mid-ships position. What a track and autocross car this could be! Race Car Replicas supplied the kit and Doug did the rest. The 1st Place Special interest award went to Doug.

The 2nd Place Special Interest award went to Steve & Mary Ellen Bales 1939 Ford Coupe. Steve did a great restoration on this car, but is well known in the winner's circle for his Mercedes 500K replica, which is in a showroom waiting for a new home.

The competition in Class B Sports was intense and resulted in Linda Ferriera taking 1st place with her Porsche 356 Coupe, built by John Steele of JPS Motorsports. 2nd Place went to Mike and Melinda Koken with their beautiful Datsun based Ferrari 250 GTO. Many worthy speedsters and Fiero based cars rounded out this class.

Class C Classics was populated with Mercedes 500K replicas. Chuck Maddux took 1st with his Heritage and Tom Wallters took 2nd with his 500K.

The Class D Classics 1st Place went to James & Robert Wagner for their Bugatti Type 35 replica and 2nd Place went to Jerry Barrilleaux with his '52 MG-TD.

The Cobra competition was close with some extraordinary cars on display. Curtis Tung's FFR Cobra took the Spectator's Choice/Best of Show award. This promoted him out of the Cobra class leaving Jim Smith, of Oakdale, as the 1st Place winner and Sherman Mah, of Concord, as the 2nd Place trophy holder.

The first day of our show was on 9/11, so we displayed a large American Flag and observed a minute of silence in memory of those lost in that 2001 attack.

At show closing time on Saturday we held a reception for car exhibitors to show our appreciation for their essential contribution to the show. Sparkling beverages and cheeses were provides by Chuck & Sue Maddux and other club members.

The next activity was a catered dinner in a private room at the Hilton. We enjoyed a Green Salad, Chicken Marsala, Rice Pilaf, Steamed Vegetables, Desserts and coffee, then had a prize drawing that netted almost everyone a gift. Following dinner we opened our hospitality suite, where we visited and swapped stories about adventures for another couple of hours.

Sunday we had some additional cars that couldn't attend Saturday. The exhibitor and spectator ballots were counted shortly after noon and the trophies were awarded during our traditional "drive-through" award ceremony. By 3 p.m. exhibitors were heading for home and club members were busy with the tear-down routine.

Our show was planned as a benefit for the local Food Bank and we were pleased to provide approximately \$600 in support of their mission of providing food for needy families.

Many thanks to the exhibitors that brought their beautiful cars and to the Hilton Hotel and staff for flawless service. Thanks also to our Show Committee and members that helped make the show a success.

REMEMBERING MARTY

Martin Rosenthal passed peacefully on September 16, 2010 after a period of declining health.

A lifelong San Franciscan, Marty grew up valuing hard work balanced by a wonderful sense of playfulness.

An avid ice skater as a young man, his favorite job as a youth was an ice guard at Sutros Bathhouse where he was able to combine his love of skating with a job he enjoyed.

Marty graduated from George Washington High School in 1953. He attended University of Colorado at Boulder where he met Bette Rosenthal, just two weeks into their freshman year. They married their senior year. After they graduated, Marty and Bette, moved to California where they raised their three children.

Marty was a pharmacist by trade. He owned his own pharmacy, Bemar Rexall, for many years prior to working for independent stores and Walgreens.

A lover of the outdoors, Marty enjoyed hunting, fishing, camping and waterskiing. He loved sharing these interests with family and friends. Many summers were spent teaching countless people how to water ski behind the family's speedy red boat.

Later on, Marty and Bette would most often be found at Sierra Point Yacht Club where they shared their love of boating with family and friends.

Marty loved his show cars. He found great pleasure in entering various cars in shows throughout the years, including his Shelby, Kurtis and his Alfa Romeo. He won many trophies and enjoyed countless hours of "car talk". He was an involved member of the NCKCC. He also had a lifelong passion for building. Model boats and airplanes were among his many projects, as were his construction of hydrofoils and even a motorized surfboard. When he had an idea he would figure out a way to make it work.

An avid traveler, he and Bette shared many adventures together across the globe. His favorite trip was an African safari.

Marty, a loving husband, brother, father, grandfather and friend, is survived by his wife of 54 years Bette Rosenthal, his sister Idell Weiss (Otto), his children Julie Rosenthal, Linda Bryson (Rudy) and Sandi Pierce (Gary), and his grandchildren Brandon, Jessica, Andrew, Tito, Allen, Cydney and Morgan.

A memorial service was held at Hills of Eternity Chapel in Colma on Friday, September 24, 2010 at 1:30pm.

ACCC PRESIDENT SPEAKS

This is the first issue of the DeFender since taking office as ACCC President on July 1, 2010 and I want to ensure all members that I will do my best to keep on top of any issues that have an effect on the car hobby. If you have any suggestions or recommendations on how to keep our hobby alive in California, please do not hesitate to let me or any of the other Directors know.

Although the 2010 Legislative session has ended, the state legislature can be called back to vote on issues, so we will not let ourselves get into a relaxed mode. As President of the Association of California Car Clubs, I am looking forward to getting new legislation ready for the 2011 session. The ACCC will be working along with other car enthusiasts to get new legislation passed that will clearly identify the definition of our classic/collector vehicles so that there is no misunderstanding of the definition. This will hopefully help us get hobby friendly legislation passed in 2011 that will both satisfy the California Air Boards and the legislators.

On Friday September 10, 2010, the Roamin Angels Car Club of Grass Valley, Ca. invited the Association of California Car Clubs to set up an information booth at the "Cruisin the Pines" car show. Thanks to our VP Vic Repstad, the following people were invited to the Friday night Tri-tip dinner and were allowed to speak to the participants. They were Congressman Tom McClintock, Assemblyman Dan Logue, Assemblyman Ted Gaines, Nevada County Supervisor Ed Schofield, NSRA Dave Cahal, Cruisin News Publisher John Sweeney and myself. The subjects ranged from keeping our cars on the road in California to Proposition 23 (suspending AB32 - Greenhouse emissions). If Proposition 23 does not pass in the November 2, election, it could impact our hobby in California. It could have an impact on the small businesses that supply our parts and a push to eliminate the older vehicles that are determined by the Air Boards to be a major polluter and health hazard to our children. I encourage you to vote YES on Proposition 23 and remember that if you will be attending the ACCC meeting on November 2, 2010 at the SEMA Show in Las Vegas, you will need to cast your vote by absentee ballot before the election date.

The 2010 ACCC meeting is on track for November 2, 2010 at the SEMA Show in Las Vegas, Nevada. We have 62 attendees signed up to attend and thanks again to the SEMA Organization for allowing the ACCC to meet in one of the Conference rooms at the Las Vegas Convention Center each year. We plan on having a guest speaker and hopefully a member of the California State Legislature that is also a member of the SEMA Automobile Caucus Group. Remember that it takes many individuals (Car enthusiasts , businesses and clubs) to keep our hobby alive in California. I would like to encourage you to talk to all your friends and ask them to join the ACCC and become a Part of the Solution. Without increased membership it is very difficult for the ACCC to stay in business and protect your classic/ collector vehicles. All it takes is a mere \$25.00 a year to become an individual member. My theory is that if you can spend thousands of your hard earned dollars to purchase or build your car, \$300 plus for a car cover to protect your valuable vehicle from the environment and many dollars to

insure it from accidents or theft, why is it so difficult to spend a mere \$25.00 a year to help protect your vehicle from being taken away from you by government regulations?

The 2011 ACCC Legislative Conference is in the planning stages and will take place again at the California Automobile Museum located at 2200 Front Street in Sacramento, California. The dates are May 11-13, 2011 and if I can get the newly elected Governor (whom ever he/she may be) to allow the ACCC to have a car display on the West Steps of the State Capitol, the show will be on Tuesday May 10, 2011. I will keep you informed of the progress as soon as possible.

Thanks to all of our Directors (who work without compensation) and members that receive this newsletter for your efforts in supporting our mission.
